## Youth Forum kicks off in Baku as part of 7th UNAOC Global Forum

The Youth Event within the 7th Global Forum of UN Alliance of Civilization kicked off in Baku on April 25.

About 250 young people, who were selected from 7,000 applicants from around the world, take part in the event to discuss and make

The forum to be held between April 25 and 27 will discuss many global issues including fight against terrorism and extremism, the role of youth, religion, education, as well as global migration and non-proliferation of hate rhetoric.
