Thematic Dialogue to mark the International Day for Dialogue among Civilizations

<u>Promoting dialogue among civilizations,</u> <u>Strengthening global solidarity and cooperation</u>

> 9 June 2025, 16:00 PM to 17:30 PM CR-2, UNHQ, New York

BACKGROUND

On 7 June 2024, the United Nations General Assembly unanimously adopted resolution A/RES/78/286 co-sponsored by over 80 Member States, declaring 10 June the International Day for Dialogue among Civilizations. It invites all Member States and organizations of the United Nations system, as well as other international and regional organizations and other relevant stakeholders to commemorate the International Day, to raise awareness of the value of the diversity of civilizations and promote dialogue, mutual respect, tolerance and global solidarity.

Dialogue among civilizations continues to be an effective tool to eliminate discrimination and prejudice, foster mutual understanding and trust-based coexistence among the peoples of the world.In the current context of multiple interconnected crises and challenges, the urgent need for dialogue and solidarity has never been more evident. The International Day provides an opportunity to foster understanding of universal values, enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. It highlights the crucial role of dialogue in maintaining global peace and how all cultures and civilizations contribute to the enrichment of humankind, and encouraging tolerance, peaceful coexistence, respect, dialogue and cooperation among different cultures, civilizations and peoples in order to promote international peace and security, human welfare, freedom and progress everywhere.

This year will mark the first International Day for Dialogue among Civilizations and twenty years since the launch of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC). To commemorate the International Day, China and UNAOC are organizing this Thematic Dialogue in collaboration with Egypt, Peru, Spain and Uzbekistan, representing various civilizations, to implement the resolution A/RES/78/286. The Thematic Dialogue will focus on the importance of fostering exchanges and mutual learning among diverse civilizations, and finding ways to revitalize global solidarity and cooperation.

OBJECTIVES

The event aims to provide a platform for all relevant stakeholders, including Member States, international organizations, private sector, academics and civil society, to discuss existing policies, practices and associated challenges in the promotion of dialogue among civilizations and explore ways and means to strength global solidarity and cooperation, so as to address current global challenges.
