They discussed synergies in their respective youth programmes aimed at building peaceful societies. The meeting was also attended by alumni of the "Leaders for Peace" campaign, a project by Rondine Cittadella Della Pace. The alumni called on the international community to support their campaign for building peaceful and inclusive societies. (22 April)

PROGRAMMING HIGHLIGHTS



UNAOC and BMW Group, with the support of Accenture, organized a webinar as part of their joint initiative the Intercultural Innovation Award (IIA). With the online workshop, the civil society organizations were mentored online on "Leadership Development", which provided them with the skills to enhance their management and team building competencies through unique approaches. (13 April)



The UNAOC Youth Solidarity Fund (YSF) was featured in the newly launched UN Peacebuilding Funding Dashboard. Through his report on peacebuilding and sustaining peace in 2018 (A/72/707-S/2018/43), the United Nations Secretary-General proposed to establish a dashboard for peacebuilding funding which seeks to catalog existing UNheadquarters-based financing instruments focused on peacebuilding and related activities. The dashboard displays information

at the level of funds and recipient entities, countries and regions, projects and individual outcomes. YSF is the only youthfocused programme featured, highlighting youth-led projects that UNAOC funded since 2015 and their respective contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals and UN peacebuilding priorities.

UNAOC, together with the Dag Hammarskjold Foundation and Justice Call, co-hosted a virtual side event on the margins of the ECOSOC Youth Forum 2022, which focused on increasing investment in flexible funding for youth-led organizations. The interactive conversation highlighted the importance and impact of flexible funding and strategies to increase investment, including public-private partnerships and multi-partner funds. Among the key take-aways from the session were: a) emphasized importance of donor flexibility and adaptability to accommodate to different contexts and changing circumstances; b) co-creation and strengthened line of communication between funders and youth-led participants; and c) engagement of private sector donors. On the margins of the ECOSOC Youth Forum 2022, UNAOC, along with UN Women, UNFPA, UNODC, UNODA and the World Organization of the Scout Movement, co-organized a thematic session related on SDG 5: Gender Equality. Among key issues, the session discussed how preventing violence against women and girls, and promoting women and girls' participation in decision-making, is fundamental to a just and sustainable COVID-19 recovery.

The session was attended by a number of young women leaders showcasing scalable solutions and outlining recommendations to center young people, their perspectives and experiences within global pandemic recovery efforts. (19 April)



On the final day of the ECOSOC Youth Forum 2022, the UN Youth Strategy was launched, the second report on the status of implementation of Youth 2030. The report highlights how the UN system is advancing global commitments for and with youth; the impact of UN strategic planning; the availability of funding and coherence; and coordination on youth work. Many UNAOC youth-related projects and activities were highlighted in the report and in the UN Action Supplement.
