The **United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC)** convened its **11th Global Forum in Riyadh**, hosted by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, under the overarching theme **“UNAOC: Two Decades of Dialogue for Humanity – Advancing a New Era of Mutual Respect and Understanding in a Multipolar World”**.

The Forum brought together **over 1,000 participants**, including high-level political leaders, multilateral organizations, religious and faith actors, and representatives from the private sector, civil society, academia, and key stakeholders. A total of **104 official delegations** attended, including **up to 40 Ministers and Deputy Ministers** and **6 Heads of International Organizations**. Youth engagement remained central to the Forum, with **71 young leaders** from 47 countries showcasing action, innovation, and impact.

The programme featured the **High-Level Meeting of the UNAOC Group of Friends**; Plenary Sessions on key themes, including **“Revitalizing Multilateralism through Inclusive Dialogue”** and **“Interfaith Dialogue as a Bridge to Peace and One Humanity”**; and interactive thematic discussions with distinguished speakers sharing valuable insights. The gathering also spotlighted special segments such as a dedicated **Youth Forum**, where alumni of UNAOC youth programmes showcased their impact stories, and the **PLURAL+ Youth Video Festival Ceremony**, which celebrated outstanding short films from young creators worldwide.

Throughout the two-day gathering, the message was clear: dialogue should be an imperative choice. As the world marks 20 years of the official launch of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations, leaders reaffirmed that peace, inclusion, and mutual respect are essential in these challenging times. The **Official Opening Ceremony** of the **11th UNAOC Global Forum** set a compelling tone, marking the 20th anniversary of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations and reaffirming the enduring importance of dialogue, mutual respect, and understanding in today's complex global landscape.

The Forum kicked off with remarks from the Host Country, represented by **His Highness Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud**, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia; **H.E. Mr. António Guterres**, United Nations Secretary-General; **H.E. Mr. Miguel Ángel Moratinos**, High Representative for UNAOC and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia; and the two co-sponsors of UNAOC, represented by **H.E. Ms. Elma Saiz Delgado**, Minister of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration of Spain, and **H.E. Mr. Binali Yıldırım**, Former Prime Minister and Former Speaker of the Grand National Assembly of Türkiye. Collectively, they underscored the vital role of UNAOC as a global platform for dialogue, mutual understanding, and cooperation in support of peace and inclusive societies.



United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres reminded participants that in a world more connected yet more fractured than ever, building bridges across faiths, cultures, and civilizations is imperative. "Some may try to dismiss the goals of the Alliance of Civilizations as utopian. To claim that dialogue and cooperation are out of fashion — too soft for our hard world. They are wrong. The mission of the Alliance of Civilizations is bold. It is essential. And it is more urgent than ever," he said.

Under-Secretary-General Miguel Ángel Moratinos, High Representative for UNAOC and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia, underscored a shared responsibility, stating, "Let us leave Riyadh with a renewed conviction: that dialogue is stronger than division, that respect is more powerful than hatred, and that peace is not a distant dream — it is a responsibility we share today." The 11th UNAOC Global Forum convened 104 official delegations in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, for the **High-level Meeting of the UNAOC Group of Friends** – including Ministers, Deputy Ministers, and Heads of International Organizations, who reaffirmed their commitment to the Alliance's enduring mission.

Co-chaired by **Under-Secretary-General Miguel Ángel Moratinos**, High Representative for UNAOC and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia, and **H.E. Mr. Walid bin Abdul Karim Al-Khuraiji**, Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the meeting featured opening remarks from United Nations Secretary-General **H.E. Mr. António Guterres**, and the co-sponsors of UNAOC, represented by **H.E. Mr. Binali Yıldırım**, former Prime Minister and former Speaker of the Grand National Assembly of Türkiye, and **H.E. Ms. Elma Saiz Delgado**, Minister of Inclusion, Social Security and Migration of Spain.

Addressing the UNAOC Group of Friends, Secretary-General António Guterres emphasized, "Your continued engagement and support, including through the Voluntary Trust Fund, will be critical as we chart the next phase of this journey. I thank you for supporting the Alliance's mandate. Let us make the most of this anniversary not only to reflect, but to recommit – to dialogue, multilateralism, and human dignity."

Under-Secretary-General Miguel Ángel Moratinos, High Representative for UNAOC and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia, reflected on the path forward, stating, "As we look ahead, the Alliance stands ready to work with you – to renew trust, to counter narratives of division, and to reaffirm a simple but powerful truth: that our diversity, when governed by mutual respect and shared responsibility, remains one of humanity's greatest strengths."

H.E. Mr. Walid bin Abdul Karim Al-Khuraiji, Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, stressed, "The Kingdom affirms its conviction that dialogue is essential to building peace and strengthening trust between peoples."

The meeting continued with interventions from Member States and International Organizations of the UNAOC Group of Friends. During the General Debate, speakers collectively underscored their commitment to UNAOC's mission to foster dialogue, mutual respect, and cooperation as essential pillars for peace, inclusion, and multilateralism in today's world. A total of 66 delegates at the level of Ministers, Vice-Ministers, Heads of International Organizations, and Ambassadors took the floor.

A key outcome of the meeting was the formal adoption of the **Final Communiqué of the 11th Global Forum of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations**, which underscored the collective resolve to strengthen intercultural and interreligious engagement and enhance cooperation in addressing shared priorities. 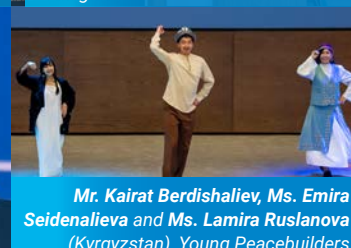

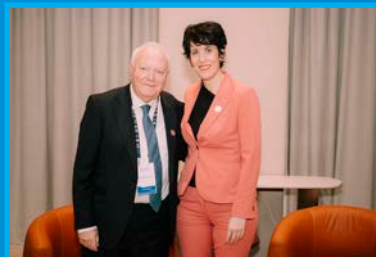


Bilateral Meetings on the Sidelines of the 11th UNAOC Global Forum in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Under-Secretary-General Miguel Ángel Moratinos, High Representative for UNAOC and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia, participated in the **UK Forum on Cultural Diplomacy 2026**, held at the House of Commons, where he addressed a high-level panel on **“The Role of Cultural Diplomacy in International Relations”**.

The event was hosted by **MP Jim Shannon** and **MP Yasmin Qureshi**, and co-organized by **MP Tasmina Ahmed Sheikh OBE** and **Mark Donfried** of the Institute of Cultural Diplomacy.

“At its most effective, cultural diplomacy does not seek to persuade or project superiority. It seeks to connect. It creates space for mutual recognition, for listening as much as for expression. It allows societies to engage with one another not only as political actors, but as human communities with histories, values, and aspirations,” Mr. Moratinos underscored.

“At a time when global polarization is increasing—when cultural identities are politicized and differences weaponized—cultural diplomacy can act as a stabilizing force. It can counter zero-sum narratives and remind us that coexistence is not weakness, but strength.” (12 January)



In London, USG Moratinos also addressed a **Special Convening on “Collaborative Approaches to Combat Islamophobia from the United Kingdom to the United Nations”**. The event was hosted by the **All-Party Parliamentary Group on British Muslims** in collaboration with the **UK Forum for Cultural Diplomacy** and the **British Muslim Trust**.

In his keynote address, Mr. Moratinos emphasized that there is a growing global recognition “...that Islamophobia is not only a matter of social prejudice, but a political challenge that demands coordinated policy responses—locally, nationally, and internationally.”

He further underscored the need for sustained and coordinated action, stating, “Combating Islamophobia requires more than statements of concern following tragic incidents. It requires sustained, preventive, and structural action. Islamophobia rarely exists in isolation. It intersects with racism, antisemitism, xenophobia, and other forms of hatred. Addressing it effectively means building alliances across communities and political lines, grounded in shared values and shared interests. From the UK to the United Nations, collaboration is not optional—it is indispensable.” (12 January)

In the framework of the **UK Forum on Cultural Diplomacy 2026**, **Ms. Nihal Saad**, Director of UNAOC, spoke at the opening segment on **“Women in Politics – Challenges and Opportunities”**, held at the UK House of Lords.

“The question before us is no longer whether women belong in politics. The question is whether our political systems are prepared to evolve — so that women can exercise power not despite institutions, but through them. That is the unfinished work of women and politics. And it is work that demands not only conviction, but courage,” she emphasized.

Other distinguished speakers included the **Right Honourable Baroness Manzila Uddin**, the **Honourable Tasmina Ahmed Sheikh OBE**, and **H.E. Irina Bokova**, among others. (12 January)





UNAOC participated in the **8th Meeting of the Working Group on the Implementation of the EU Strategy on Combating Antisemitism and Fostering Jewish Life** in Brussels, which brought together representatives of national Jewish communities, international and civil society organisations, and high-level officials of European Institutions. Discussions focused on the current state of national strategies and action plans to combat antisemitism, Holocaust remembrance, and the growing challenges faced by Jewish communities amid rising anti-Jewish hatred and recent terrorist attacks. (14 January)



USG Moratinos attended the **Holocaust Remembrance Conference: "Remembering the past, shaping the future"**, organized by the European Commission in partnership with the Cyprus Presidency of the Council of the European Union and in cooperation with the American Jewish Committee Transatlantic Institute, B'nai B'rith International, Conference of European Rabbis, European Jewish Association, European Jewish Congress, European Jewish Community Center, European Union of Jewish Students, European Union of Progressive Judaism, Hias Europe and World Jewish Congress. 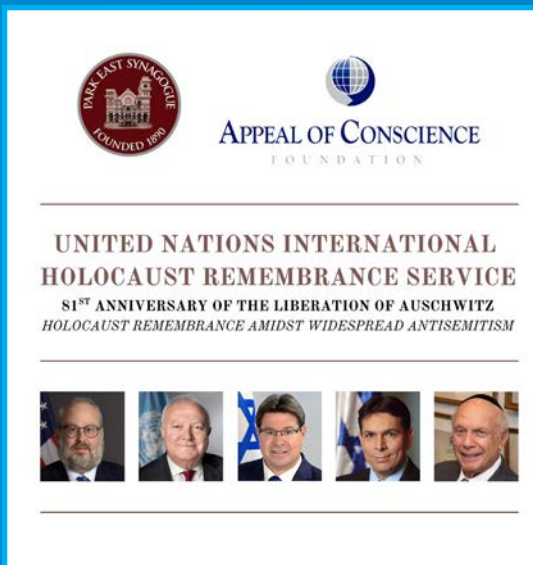
In Brussels, Mr. Moratinos had a meeting with members of **Socialistas Españoles en el Parlamento Europeo (Spanish Socialists in the European Parliament)**. They discussed the role of the United Nations and the European Union in an increasingly complex geopolitical context. (15 January)

HIGHLIGHTS

The High Representative participated in the **United Nations International Holocaust Remembrance Service** held at **Park East Synagogue** in New York to mark the **81st anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz**. The solemn commemoration brought together senior diplomats, faith leaders, Holocaust survivors, and members of the diplomatic corps to honor the victims and reaffirm the global commitment to combating antisemitism.

The High Representative delivered remarks alongside **H.E. Ambassador Rabbi Yehuda Kaploun**, U.S. Department of State Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Antisemitism; **H.E. Ofir Akunis**, Consul General of Israel in New York; **H.E. Danny Danon**, Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations; and **Rabbi Arthur Schneier**, Holocaust survivor and Senior Rabbi of Park East Synagogue.

In his address, the High Representative underscored the urgent responsibility of remembrance amid the rise of antisemitism worldwide and emphasized the importance of education, interfaith solidarity, and collective action to uphold human dignity and historical truth. “We gather not simply to recall an unspeakable human atrocity, but to reaffirm our moral obligation — to truth, dignity and vigilance,” he stressed. (26 January)



The international community gathered at the **United Nations Headquarters** in New York to observe the **International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust**. The annual event, held on the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, brought together Holocaust survivors, senior UN officials, civil society, and representatives of Member States to reflect on the legacy of the Holocaust and recommit to standing against antisemitism, racism, and intolerance.

Hosted by **Ms. Melissa Fleming**, United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Global Communications, the observance included testimony from Holocaust survivors alongside addresses by **H.E. Mr. António Guterres**, United Nations Secretary-General; **H.E. Ms. Annalena Baerbock**, President of the 80th session of the United Nations General Assembly; **H.E. Mr. Danny Ben Yosef Danon**, Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations; **H.E. Mr. Michael G. Waltz**, Permanent Representative of the United States to the United Nations; **H.E. Mr. Vassily A. Nebenzia**, Permanent Representative of the Russian Federation to the United Nations; and **H.E. Mr. James Kariuki**, Deputy Permanent Representative and Charge d'Affaires of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the United Nations. Speakers emphasized the enduring importance of remembrance as a foundation for human rights, education, and safeguarding human dignity.

In his remarks, the Secretary-General called on the international community to confront hatred and discrimination in all their forms and to ensure that the lessons of history guide efforts to build a more just and peaceful world for future generations. (27 January)



The High Representative participated in the **International Holocaust Remembrance Day Commemoration** organized by the **American Jewish Committee (AJC)** at their headquarters in New York.

In his address, Mr. Moratinos underscored, “The Holocaust stands as a permanent warning of where antisemitism, dehumanization, and especially indifference can lead when institutions fail, when hate is normalized, when unspeakable atrocities are tolerated... To remember the Holocaust is to accept a moral horizon for our institutions and ourselves. Memory must shape how we speak, how we educate, and how we act when hatred resurfaces in familiar and new forms.”

Other distinguished speakers included Mr. Chaloka Beyani, Special Adviser to the Secretary-General on the Prevention of Genocide; **H.E. Mr. Jeffrey Bartos**, U.S. Representative for UN Management and Reform; **H.E. Mr. Jonathan Miller**, Deputy Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations; **Rabbi Andrew Baker**, AJC Director of International Jewish Affairs; and **Professor Rosa Freedman**, Professor of Law Conflict and Global Development at the University of Reading School of Law in the UK. The High Representative for UNAOC participated in the **3rd African and Euro-Mediterranean Youth Summit (Sommet des Jeunes Africains et Euroméditerranéens de l'Université Euromed de Fès)**, held at the Royal Academy of Morocco in Rabat under the overarching theme, **"Civic Responsibility and Pluralism of Values"**. The event was hosted by the **Euromed University of Fez (UEMF)**, through its United Nations Chair for the Alliance of Civilizations (UNCAC), in cooperation with the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC).

Organized by students of the **Euromed University of Fez** and supported by leading national and international institutions, including the **Royal Academy of Morocco** and the **Hassan II Academy of Sciences and Techniques**, the Summit convened young leaders from more than 40 countries, as well as academics, experts, and institutional leaders. Participants engaged in high-level dialogue on civic responsibility, diversity, social cohesion, and shared values.

USG Moratinos addressed the opening session, alongside **Mr. Abdeljalil Lahjomri**, Permanent Secretary of the Academy of the Kingdom of Morocco; **Mr. Omar Fassi Fihri**, Permanent Secretary of the Hassan II Academy of Sciences and Technology; Professor **Mostapha Bousmina**, President of the EuroMed University of Fez; and **Professor Abdelhak Azzouzi**, President of UNCAC, member of the Board of Directors of UEMF. The High Representative was the keynote speaker in a virtual event titled **"UN at Your Doorstep: Global Dialogue on Peace and Security"**, organized by the **Sustainable Development Solutions Network, Ages of Globalization, the Global Schools Program, and Compass Education**. He was joined by **Professor Jeffrey Sachs**, Economist and President of the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network, who also delivered a keynote address, along with distinguished youth and civil society speakers.

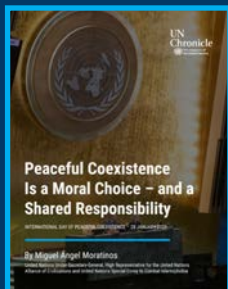


The event featured an interactive dialogue among global leaders, youth researchers, and peacebuilders from around the world, focusing on the vital role of peace and security as foundations for human dignity and sustainable development. (28 January)



The High Representative took part in a roundtable titled **"Interreligious Approaches for Peaceful Coexistence"**, marking the first commemoration of the **International Day of Peaceful Coexistence**. The event was hosted by the **Permanent Mission of Austria to the United Nations in New York** and organized by the **International Dialogue Centre (KAICIID)**.

The High Representative delivered a keynote address following opening remarks by **H.E. Mr. Gregor W. Koessler**, a Permanent Representative of Austria to the United Nations, and **H.E. Ambassador António de Almeida Ribeiro**, Acting Secretary-General of KAICIID. Speakers highlighted the role of interreligious cooperation in promoting social cohesion, preventing violence, and strengthening respect for diversity. (27 January)



On the first **International Day of Peaceful Coexistence**, observed on 28 January, Under-Secretary-General Miguel Ángel Moratinos, High Representative for the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC) and UN Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia, called on the global community to embrace peaceful coexistence as both a moral choice and a shared responsibility.

In his UN Chronicle article, he stressed that peace is far more than the absence of conflict; it is an active, collective endeavour that requires us to move beyond tolerance to genuine mutual respect and understanding.

At the **11th UNAOC Global Forum**, young leaders proved that peacebuilding is not just theory, it is practice. It is real. It has faces, voices, and names.

Three young alumni of the UNAOC Young Peacebuilders programme – **Ana Kuprava** from Georgia, **Maria Yesayan** from Armenia, and **Shahim Afandiyeva** from Azerbaijan – showed what peacebuilding looks like in action.

It was through the UNAOC Young Peacebuilders programme that they shared a space for dialogue, one where youth could listen, speak openly, and collaborate beyond borders. What began as dialogue became action: joint initiatives, peer education, and honest conversations on identity, gender equality, extremism, and coexistence. (15 December)

As part of their joint **"News Generation Against Hate"** initiative, UNAOC and the municipality of La Courneuve, France hosted a showcase event for youth participants, facilitators, and guests. Featuring highlights from the programme's workshops, followed by an interactive audience Q&A, the event marks the culmination of the third edition of the programme, which was launched in 2020. USG Moratinos, High Representative of UNAOC, and Mr. Gilles Poux, Mayor of La Courneuve, conferred certificates of achievement to the youth for their participation in the "News Generation Against Hate". (30 January)



UNAOC and Fundación Mujeres por África organized a new workshop for participants of their joint **"Women's Alliance for Peace (WA4P)"** initiative. WA4P aims to strengthen the role of women as negotiators, mediators, and peacemakers, particularly in contexts with sociocultural and religious dimensions. The session – which brought together grassroots and high-level leaders from countries such as Mali, the Central African Republic, and the Democratic Republic of Congo – focused on managing emotions in mediation processes, underscoring the challenges mediators face in difficult and complex conflict settings, and the impact of emotional dynamics on trust-building, effective dialogue, and conflict resolution.
